Sinusotomy indications

Absolute indications for sinus surgery include:

- Orbital abscess secondary to acute infection
- Frontal lobe abscess/meningitis secondary to acute infection, mucocele or fungal mycetoma

Relative indications for sinus surgery include:

- Chronic rhinosinusitis failing medical therapy
- Headaches of sinus origin
- Facial pain
- Recurrent acute sinusitis
- Obstructive nasal polyposis
- Asthma exacerbations in patients with Samter triad
